

The regular meeting of the Truman City Council was held May 2, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Brownlee.

1. MINUTES

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Bressler to approve the minutes of the Board of Appeals & Equalization meeting held April 18, 2016 and the last regular meeting held April 18, 2016. All yeas - carried.

2. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 909.01B TO IDENTIFY THE CORRECT NAME OF THE CURRENT CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISEE; AMENDING SECTION 909.04 EXTENDING THE TERM OF THE CURRENT FRANCHISE HELD BY FORT RANDALL CABLE SYSTEMS, INC. - ORDINANCE #2016-3

Randy Maserek from Clara City Telephone Company was present for the renewal of the cable television franchise. It is a 15 year non-exclusive franchise. One concern noted was the weather channel not always having the Truman information available. Maserek stated sun outages sometimes effects the weather channel in all 48 states.

A motion was made by Bressler, seconded by Ebert to offer Ordinance #2016-3 to renew the 15 year cable television franchise to Fort Randall Cable Systems (Clara City Telephone). All yeas - carried.

3. STREET DANCE MOVED TO GRAF PARK

There were some residents in attendance to comment on the idea of moving the Truman Days street dance to Graf Park. The street dance committee members showed a proposed layout of the tent and beer garden for the dance. Portable lighting will be added for visibility around the park. The band would be done by 12:30 a.m. and the beer garden vacated by 1:00 a.m. This would allow the food vendors to stay at the park. The ambulance department asked that the streets remain open around the park for emergency calls. Resident Connie Krause was concerned that it is a residential area and the liability to property owners. The Truman Days Committee was in favor of the idea to keep it going. The Tru Cru would set it up and the scouts will be asked to help clean up the park afterwards. The profits of the dance go to the Truman Days committee, the parade committee and other community projects. The kids will have a kids section to make it a family event. Councilor Mosloski said the area will be tight with vendors there. A 100 amp service will be needed for the band according to Greg Leiferman. Police Chief Jobe said the street on the south side of the park will have to be open for the dance. Councilor Ebert said with less people helping with the event that having it at the park would help the staff. Councilor Hendricksen said she is against it due to the neighbor liability concerns.

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Bressler to try having the Truman Days street dance at Graf Park this year. Yeas - Bressler, Ebert, Brownlee; Nays - Hendricksen, Mosloski. Motion carried.

4. PROCLAMATION FOR BIKE TO SCHOOL AND WALK TO WORK DAY

Kathy Sorenson from the Truman Active Living Committee was present asking for a proclamation for the May 20 Bike to School and Walk to Work Day. There will be a bike rodeo for 138 kids at school that day. Greg Leiferman said he is interested in having a raffle to give away a fat-tire bike with the proceeds going toward Truman Days or helmets for kids.

A motion was made by Bressler, seconded by Ebert to proclaim May 20, 2016 as Bike to School and Walk to Work Day in Truman. All yeas - carried.

5. GRAF PARK POWER UPGRADES

Greg Leiferman from G & D Electric presented ideas for electrical upgrades at Graf Park for Truman Days events. Additional power will be bored in from the east of the park and then electrical boxes will be installed for food vendors. The cost will be just over \$7,000. This cost was budgeted for 2016.

A motion was made by Bressler, seconded by Mosloski to have G & D Electric do the electrical upgrades at Graf Park. All yeas - carried.

6. TENNIS COURT PROPERTY TRANSFER FROM SCHOOL

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Hendricksen to approve a transfer of the tennis court property from the Truman Public School for \$1.00, allowing the school to use it for athletic practice, and with the stipulation that if the city wants to sell the property that the school gets first option to buy it back. All yeas - carried.

The city will pay for the survey and preparing the deed for signatures. The school board still has to take final action on this matter before it is final.

7. FRONT YARD PARKING ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT DENIED

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Mosloski to deny the zoning commission recommendation to amend the zoning code for front yard parking. All yeas - carried.

8. BLACKTOPPING ALLEY REQUEST DENIED

Based on city attorney recommendation not to allow blacktopping of city alley due to utilities in the alley, a motion was made by Bressler, seconded by Mosloski to deny Tim Bartels request to blacktop the alley south of his residence. All yeas - carried.

9. CITY CLAIMS

A motion was made by Bressler, seconded by Mosloski to approve the city claims:

All yeas - carried. Councilor Ebert abstained on Superior Contracting Services claim.

10. MISCELLANEOUS

Discussed depth of new drains at Graf Park. Will see if the tile can be raised and if the low spot can be filled. Also will see if a roller can be used on the rough ground.

Will have the campground lot surveyed to find property lines. Also will look at extending the driveway for larger camping vehicles.

The old tables from the community building will be given to the fire department for events at the fire hall.

11. ADJOURN
