

The regular meeting of the Truman City Council was held July 20, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Brownlee.

1. MINUTES

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Ebert to approve the minutes of the special meeting held July 13, 2015 and the last regular meeting held July 6, 2015 with an addition on Item #3 that the coverage for Lewisville ambulance would be 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. All yeas - carried.

2. BENEFIT AT COMMUNITY BUILDING

Candace Shahan was present and asked if they could use the community building rent free on August 9 for a combined benefit for her brother and his friend who both were diagnosed with cancer.

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Mosloski to not charge the community building rental fee for the benefit being held on August 9, 2015 for Joe Marushin and Jim Small. All yeas - carried.

3. LEWISVILLE AMBULANCE SERVICE

The ambulance department met and agreed to help out Lewisville with ambulance calls from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. until the end of the year.

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Hendricksen to approve the Ambulance Service Contract with the City of Lewisville. All yeas - carried.

The Lewisville city council meets next week to decide on the Agreement.

4. MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

City Clerk Monte Rohman presented the June financial report and went over some of the line items. There were questions on a few of the items.

6. GRAF PARK

Greg Leiferman from G & D Electric was present to discuss electrical upgrades that are needed at Graf Park to handle Truman Days events and to upgrade the existing shelter house service. He found a temporary fix for one of the food vendors that needed a 50-amp service for their trailer. He said the power line feeding the park from the north is undersized to handle everything at the park along with the five houses north of the park. He said it would cost about \$3,200 to bring power into the park from a transformer a half block east of the park that has adequate power available. It would cost another \$6,800 for wiring, outlets, and a new main panel in the park. The council will consider these costs in the city budget process for 2016.

7. MISCELLANEOUS

Discussed trees in boulevards that need to be trimmed. This is the homeowner's responsibility.
