

The regular meeting of the Truman City Council was held October 3, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Brownlee.

Present: Councilors Ebert, Hendricksen
Absent: Councilors Bressler, Mosloski

1. MINUTES

A motion was made by Hendricksen, seconded by Ebert to approve the minutes of the work session held September 15, 2016 and the last regular meeting held September 19, 2016. All yeas - carried.

2. ENGINEERING REPORT ON STORM WATER

City Engineer Greg Mitchell from Bolton & Menk presented reports on proposals to correct storm water ponding in a few areas of town. To build a storm water holding pond east of the community building would be \$95,700 if the dirt was piled on site. The cost would be \$202,900 with a larger pond if the soil was hauled off site. New catch basins would be installed and a large pipe would carry the water to the ponds and then the ponds would feed into a smaller pipe back into the existing undersized storm water pipes which are in bad condition. The pond would be about 4-feet deep. The pond would handle a 3-inch rainfall event under the first option and a 4-inch rainfall under the second option. To rebuild the six blocks to put in the 30-inch and 36-inch diameter size storm water pipes to take care of the ponding issues would cost from \$1 million to \$1.5 million. The big question is acquiring the land to build the ponds and an easement would be needed west of 3rd Street North.

The other proposal looked at was rebuilding one block of street north of Graf Park on North 3rd Avenue East to an intersection that still has ponding issues in larger rain events. The engineer's estimate for total reconstruction with a 24-inch storm water pipe would be \$358,770.

3. QUARTERLY POLICE REPORT

Police Chief Justin Jobe presented the quarterly police report. There have been around 800 calls for service so far this year. The department was part of a successful jury trial that convicted a criminal. Jobe also presented more information on the St. James ordinance that requires house numbers for all buildings. Jobe said the new door hangers are working well and a couple houses have cleaned up their yards.

4. COMMUNITY BUILDING FRONT DOOR REPLACED

Reviewed two quotes for the replacement of the front door at the community building. The project would replace the current two doors with one 42-inch wide handicapped accessible door.

A motion was made by Hendricksen, seconded by Ebert to accept the low quote of \$5,150 from Fairmont Glass & Sign to replace the front door at Truman Community Building. All yeas - carried.

5. CITY CLAIMS

A motion was made by Ebert, seconded by Hendricksen to approve the city claims:

6. MISCELLANEOUS

Had a quarterly review of the list of goals and discussed some of the issues.
