

The regular meeting of the Truman City Council was held May 21, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Brownlee

Absent: Councilor Ebert

1. MINUTES

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Hendricksen to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting held May 7, 2018. All yeas - carried.

2. CLARIFICATION OF DECEMBER 4, 2017 MINUTES - FIRE RELIEF PENSION AMOUNT

A motion was made by Hendricksen, seconded by Nickerson to amend the December 4, 2017 minutes to clarify that the Fire Relief Association pension amount would be \$900 per year of service effective January 1, 2018. All yeas - carried. Councilor Mosloski abstained.

3. MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

City Clerk Monte Rohman presented the April monthly financial report and went over some of the line items.

A motion was made by Hendricksen, seconded by Nickerson to approve the April, 2018 financial report. All yeas - carried.

4. HIRING PROCESS - CITY ADMINISTRATOR POSITION

Interviews with nine applicants were held May 14 and 15 by the city council and city clerk. The following three people were selected for a second interview: Deanna Anderson, Jeffrey Pederson and Bethanie Ekstrom.

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Nickerson to hold a special meeting on Wednesday, May 30, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. to hold second interviews with the three finalists for the city administrator position and discuss salary range and benefits. All yeas - carried.

5. CITY CLAIMS

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Hendricksen to approve the city claims:

All yeas - carried.

6. LEASE/PURCHASE APPROVED FOR SNOWPLOW TRUCK - FIRST GOVERNMENT LEASE CO.

Interest rates from three leasing companies were reviewed for financing the purchase of the new snowplow truck and box.

A motion was made by Mosloski, seconded by Nickerson to approve a lease/purchase agreement with First Government Lease Company for the 2018 Snow Plow Truck at a rate of 4.39% for five years. All yeas - carried.

7. MISCELLANEOUS

Judi Davis from Truman PUC reported on working relationship between street department and PUC crew. The PUC crew will not be used for blacktop patching. There were concerns about the repairs to the jetter too.

Discussed some of the drainage issues on the north side of town. Councilor Hendricksen said some of the storm lines are plugged in that area.

Trees need to be trimmed at Jaycee Park.

Will look into the cost for a cab and snow blower to put on the John Deere riding mower.

Brian Nickerson repaired the cracks in the stainless steel gutters at the pool.

Councilor Hendricksen volunteered to paint the picnic at the campground.

Police Chief Justin Jobe reported that he is working on ordinance violations.

Also the new squad car is getting equipment installed and should be in operation next week. He is having some wiring issues with the speed sign.
